When digital books took off in around 2007, many people thought it meant the end of the line for paper books. Paper book sales plummeted, and some large bookstores were forced to close their doors. But just over a decade later, e-book sales are starting to fall and paper books are making a comeback. So  
5 what happened?

Digital books may be ( 1 ) more convenient than you realized.  
(2) Obviously, [space / you buy, / less / more / the / paper books / the] you have in your home or your backpack. Digital books suffer from no such limitation — you could carry an entire library around town without breaking a  
10 sweat. Digital books offer different fonts, character sizes, and formats to help people with visual problems or reading disorders like \*dyslexia. And you can even take notes in them without ruining the pages. It seems like their only major shortcoming is that they become useless when their batteries are drained. But some modern e-book readers can last for weeks on a single  
15 charge, and the more technology advances, the better batteries become.

However, convenience isn't everything. ( 3 ) all the advantages that digital books offer, they fall short when it comes to the sensory experience.  
(4) Top-of-the-line digital book readers can no more produce that familiar “\*old book smell” than a rock can. And book lovers share a particular fondness for  
20 the atmosphere of the local library or bookstore, like visiting long lost friends.
